Scholarship Application Submittal Deadline for Fall Term is May 15, 2019

Scholarship Eligibility:

- Graduate of public or private high school or homeschool program in the State of Colorado
- Resident of the State of Colorado for at least one year
- Expectation to attend Florida State University, or letter of acceptance to FSU

Selection Criteria:

- Applicants are expected to complete the attached scholarship application form and provide answers to the essay questions (provide responses with 1 to 2 paragraphs for each essay question)
- Use the essay portion to demonstrate your personality, leadership, personal beliefs, education, and lessons you have learned.
- Applications and essays will be reviewed by a committee selected by the Seminole Club of the Rockies Board of Directors

Other pertinent information regarding the scholarship:

- SCOR Scholarships will be provided for each calendar year in the Fall.
- Each scholarship is for one calendar year only, following years will require a new application
- The scholarship will be awarded through Florida State University and not by SCOR
- Selection process is final, applicants can apply for following periods for future consideration
- Final selection results will only be held by SCOR committee & Board of Directors
- Requirements for the release of scholarship funds will be based on Florida State University Policy
- Florida State University has the right to deny scholarship payments, if the applicant does not meet the academic, acceptance or enrollment criteria for admission into Florida State University.
- Due to NCAA & FSU Policy, Current Active Student Athletes cannot be awarded a scholarship of this type.

Please provide your answer in the form of a narrative of how you did something or planned to do something as a student, student intern, Campus organization leader, Participant in a campus cause, activity outside of Florida State working with a community service or charity organization or actions to support a friend or family member.

Responses are limited to 500 words. Please save your responses in a word document and include with your application.

- 1.) During your time as a student at Florida State University, describe an activity or situation where you had to exhibit personal strength to overcome a situation or conflict with others? How did you address the issue or problem? What was the result?
- 2.) What skill have you been able to use or develop during your time at Florida State University? How did this skill help you solve a problem?
- 3.) As a Florida State Student, describe a time where you had to exhibit good character or stand for a position with a group of people or given individual in order to be sure that the activity or decision being conducted follows a better course of action in a more advantageous (moral, respectable, suitable) result.

Now these questions pertain to you following your time at Florida State University:

- 4.) After graduating from Florida State University, where do you see yourself making an impact or contribute toward an initiative in your field of study? What are your goals and how will you help contribute to others (can be non-field of study item) or community?
- 5.) Florida State University has over 368,000 alumni across the United States and the world.
